

# Bib Sheet [SOLUTION]

A “bib sheet” is a competitive eater’s intro sheet. The city and age listed on the top of the bib sheet refer to the organization Major League Eating (MLE) which was started in NYC 20 years ago.

Taking all the numbers mentioned in the bib sheet in order and using them to index into the alphabet gives 9 14 4 5 24 | 9 14 20 15 | 14 1 13 5 | 2 25 | 18 5 3 15 18 4 | 13 15 4 | 14 1 13 5 → INDEX INTO NAME BY RECORD MOD NAME.

Taking the first letter of each word in each sentence spells foods, one for each paragraph. We then notice each of these foods is an eating event competition (also aided by the hint from the numbers) listed on MLE’s records [page](#). Finding the record associated with the food and the record holder and indexing (mod the name) gives the following.
